


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

fter completing a top-to-bottom renovation in 2021 of Opal Grand Oceanfront Resort & Spa in Delray Beach, Opal Collection was eager to showcase that elevated experience that comes with a stay at this Atlantic Ocean—adjacent property. That's why they worked with The Prism House (theprismhouse. com), a full-service production firm specializing in brand storytelling and all that comes with it, to capture the hotel's unique new vibe on this issue's cover.

"The second you step foot onto that property, you're entirely immersed in this 'upscale tropical' experience," says Kristin Mitchell, creative director who co-owns The Prism House with production director Carrie Scott. Here, she shares a few of her most memorable moments during her time spent capturing every nook and cranny of this reinvigorated resort.

#### FIRST IMPRESSION

"The first thing that really struck me was the arrival experience, particularly in reference to the lobby. Everything centers around this huge skylight that features three large trees beneath it and is surrounded by rope-wrapped columns, potted palm plants, and gorgeous hanging swing chairs. I guess you could say that everything felt very "grand."

#### FAVORITE SPOT

"I love a beautiful pool, and this one stuns with a huge coral-inspired deck with little sections cut out for palm trees, making it feel very much like a surprising tropical sanctuary amid Delray's popular downtown stretch of Atlantic Avenue. And while the property doesn't sit directly on the beach – it's right across the street – the pool does a beautiful job framing that view of the ocean."

#### SUGGESTED TO-DO

"Definitely make time for a drink at Monkey Bar – it's the resort's restaurant and lounge that serves up creative cocktails with names like 'King Kong,' 'The Smoking Banana,' and 'The Baboon' in a jungle-inspired space. My favorite was the watermelon mezcal margarita, which felt perfectly suited to living up life in this beautiful beach resort."







#### MAKING SMILEY MASKS FOR MANY Bar Harbor, ME

When PPE was hard to come by at the start of the pandemic, Kali Liimatainen, the general manager for Bar Harbor's Harborside Hotel, Spa & Marina, didn't just take it upon herself to kick-start a mask-making effort, she made sure it came with a smile. We mean that quite literally: The 250 masks she enlisted her sewing star of a stepmother to hand make for employees of both Harborside and West Street hotels actually featured smiles on the front. "It was so that guests could still see a smile as a warm greeting, even though our faces are covered," says Liimatainen, who also had excess masks shipped and distributed to staff at fellow Opal Collection property, Samoset Resort, in Rockport. "Some guests even offered to buy them from us," adds Liimatainen with a laugh. "I kept a small stash in my office for those instances."

### SHOPPING FOR OUR MOST VULNERABLE POPULATION

#### Portsmouth, NH

Starting in spring of 2020, Catherine Shane – the longtime content manager for *Opal Magazine* – worked with the housing authority in her New Hampshire Seacoast town to spearhead a free grocery shopping service for the town's low-income elderly residents. Between the months of June and

October, Shane took grocery orders for up to 20 residents a week, made as many as three trips a week to the grocery store and food pantries, then delivered the orders to their doorsteps, so they didn't have to risk going out in public. During one particular grocery trip in August, she filled five shopping carts with \$455.44 worth of items on behalf of 11 different households.

## HOTELS STEPPING UP TO SERVE AS VACCINATION CENTERS ROCKPORT & Bar Harbor, ME

What do you do when you have two hotels closed for the winter season? Why not volunteer those large, empty spaces to serve

as vaccination distribution centers? That's precisely what Maine's Samoset Resort in Rockport and affiliate property, Bar Harbor Regency in Bar Harbor, both did in early spring of 2021 in conjunction with their local hospitals (with Maine Health in Rockland and Mount Desert Island Hospital in Bar Harbor). Using their lobbies for appointment check-in and screening, with vaccinations administered in a ballroom or function space, these two resorts were able to each churn out 500-plus vaccinations a day.





## Opal's Ode to Key West

While you can find K.C. Scott's marine prints in various Florida Opal properties, when it came to talk artwork for The Capitana Key West, only a custom painting by the world-renowned artist would do - not just to serve the guests of the resort, but the local public too.

reatures are very real at The Capitana Key West. In fact, as you drive up to the portico of Opal's latest boutique hotel, opened in February 2021, they're the first thing you see, captured in a 25-by-32-foot, billboard-sized mural displayed on the hotel's stark-white exterior. It's actually a digital wrap of the same 8-by-11-foot color painting that hangs in the tropically chic lobby of the hotel.

Painted by K.C. Scott, a West Palmbased artist, the custom pieces, depicting the sea creatures in their natural Florida Keys habitat, weren't just a commission for the hotel. They were also a commission for the island of Key West. That's because the purchase serves as a contribution – equivalent to more than \$75,000 – to the Key West Art in Public Places program, a local effort to facilitate the creation of beautiful new public works of art for residents and visitors. That means guests of the hotel don't just get to enjoy the artworks, but the public is welcome to visit the property to take in the works too. And it's actually just part of \$1 million that Opal has donated to Greater Key West in the last year alone.

"I wanted to paint something that played off the hotel's shipwreck motif, but also felt very 'Key West' to me," says Scott, whose work can be found all over the world. "And what's more Key West than Caribbean lobster and tarpon?"

While the pro-golfer-turned-pro-painter has additional prints on display at other Opal resorts and hotels – including Hutchinson Shores Resort & Spa, Zota Beach Resort, Lido Beach Resort, Sandpearl Resort in Clearwater Beach, and even in 50 Ocean, an affiliate restaurant in Delray Beach – this work was an original painting for the hotel. Done in acrylics, it took Scott a painstaking two months to paint. "I started working on it right around the time my second child was due," says the 41-year-old. "When I finally saw it installed, I felt a little bit like I had two new babies."



#### **About The Capitana Key West**

The custom mural is only one wow factor associated with this newly opened boutique hotel, inspired by a famous shipwreck from Spain's 1733 Armada. There's also a three-acre pool area, home to a watery oasis the size of a football field, food and beverage service at McKee's Tiki Bar, and loungers and hammocks on the beach – all overlooking Key West's beautiful Gulf waters. As for the accommodations, all rooms and suites in the main hotel offer water views, furnished balconies, and chic island-inspired design. But if you're looking to really indulge yourself, a series of nine two-bedroom private cottages are set right on the canal and offer the utmost privacy. Think full kitchens, furnished decks, and a dedicated spa pool.

## Holes with History

Just as Belleview Inn pays tribute to its history as a Gilded Age Gulf icon, the two historic Donald Rossdesigned golf courses at the neighboring Belleair Country Club evoke a flashback to the days when clubs were wooden and golf knickers were de rigueur.



e may jokingly go by the title of PGA "Emeritus" now, but there really is no one who knows Belleair Country Club's two Donald Ross historic golf courses like Bill Conway. So much so, he can recite the exact vardage that all 36 holes play from the black, blue, and white tees. That's because he had spent more than 40 years on the courses – first working as the assistant golf professional from 1962 to 1971, then taking over the role of director of golf and head golf pro from 1971 until he retired in 2005. During those years, he interacted with scores of celebs on their swings - from former presidents Ford and Bush Senior to baseball Hall of Famer Tom Seaver ("he was a good friend," notes Conway) and John Travolta. During 10 years from the 1960s into the '70s, Conway even lived in the former iteration of Belleview Inn. "My room was on the fourth floor, which is where the staff lived, but, now, it's the penthouse," he laughs. "So I can brag and say I lived in the penthouse."

But just because Conway, now 80 and active as ever, retired as the PGA pro doesn't mean he's out of the game. In fact, he's currently working on a book about the history of the Belleair Country Club and its golf courses alongside local historian Christopher Stills, and a syndicated writer for ESPN, Hal Bodley. Otherwise, guests - who have access to these two courses, named the East and the West Course, when they stay at the Belleview Inn – will see this Clearwater Beach local around the pro shop, taking lunch at the clubhouse, and, of course, swinging a club on these notable holes that he knows like the back of his

#### **West Course**

#### Hole #4

Of the two golf courses, the West Course has better maintained its Donald Ross design – and this particular par-3 has not changed one bit. "I've seen old pictures of



the hole – even from before my time at the club – and it looks exactly the same," says Conway. Playing 176 yards from the black tee, the layout features an elevated green a signature of the Donald Ross design.

#### Hole #5

"Bring your A-game to this long par-4, which measures 419 yards from the black tee," says Conway. With bunkers on either side, it calls for a good tee shot in which you have a little carry over water to the left-hand side. From there, your second shot is onto a very well-protected green that requires you to hit over the creek that meanders through both courses. "Every issue, USGA Golf Journal Magazine selects and profiles a different great golf hole from around the country on its back cover," explains Conway. "I can't tell you the exact year it was, but this hole has made their back cover."

#### Hole #6

This 490-yard-from-the-black-tee par-5 isn't just challenging because of the eight or nine bunkers that run along the length of the hole, but because it's notorious for compromising players' focuses. That's because it's just so darn gorgeous. "It runs along the top of the bluff overlooking Clearwater Bay and what is probably the highest point in Pinellas County," says Conway. "When we updated the golf course back in the '70s, the designer, Gene Bates, said it was likely the single most costly piece of real estate he had ever worked on."


#### **East Course**

#### Holes #10, #11 & #12

After a leisurely front 9, the back 9 is where this course starts to show its teeth - particularly on holes 10 and 11, which are both long (413 and 414 yards, respectively), dogleg par-4s that require strong tee shots. Hole 12 is a 508-yard par-5, and a risk-reward with water carry on your second and third shots. "These three warm you up perfectly for what's to come: the signature 14th hole," says Conway.

#### Hole #14

Likely the course's most challenging, this 409-yard par-4 is a very tight hole that calls for a well-placed tee shot, where you must drive toward the Gulf and Sand Kev. The second shot is a blind shot straight ahead, up and over the bluff, "It calls for a very precise, very exact shot because the seawall to Clearwater Bay backs right up to the green," cautions Conway. "If you hit over the green, your ball will be swallowed up by the bay." Making par on this hole is like making birdie – so much so that *LIFE* Magazine even took notice. "Hanging in the pro shop is a copy of LIFE Magazine from 1947 that called this particular hole one of the top in the country," says Conway. "Naturally, that was for its mix of beauty and challenge.'

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## A New Wave of Wellness

While Delray Beach has always been a town touted for its idyllic blend of bigcity attitude and shoreside sanctuary, with the recent addition of Opal Grand Oceanfront Resort & Spa, the town's personality seems to be tipping more toward a mindfulness mecca.

sk any local to describe their ocean-side community of Delray Beach in just a few words and you'll receive a string of what seem to be contradictory statements: "A quiet haven" parallels "swinging nightlife," "laid-back beach town" is countered by "buzzy downtown," and "small-town vibe" is followed by "big-city personality."

No, these individuals aren't downplaying or exaggerating anything. Nor are they incorrect in their descriptions. In the last decade, this community of 75,000 perched along the Atlantic in Southeast Florida has managed to cultivate an uncanny sense of both relaxed retreat and happening city-like vibes. By day, folks on bicycles or skates push past bronzed surfers along the pedestrian-friendly, north-to-south-running Ocean Boulevard; by night, the downtown east-to-west stretch of Atlantic Avenue - pulsing with art galleries, high-brow boutiques, and bars and restaurants – calls to a cast of characters ready to eat, drink, and be merry. In a way, these roads quite literally create an intersection of metropolitan and mindfulness.

Yet, in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, it's being forecasted that wellness getaways will come roaring into style more than ever: People are looking for destinations that allow them to connect with others, as well as disconnect from the daily stresses of the pandemic. So as much as Delray Beach's lively side continues to grow with new boutiques, bars, and cultural outlets, the wellness and self-care aspect of this destination is arguably going to be flourishing even more.

charge: Opal's recently revitalized Opal on the corner of Atlantic Avenue and Ocean Boulevard, this shoreside sanctuary is designed with one thing and one thing in mind: to serve as Delray's holistic retreat, where every amenity has been created with relaxation and rejuvenation coastal-chic atmosphere and the dining as well as an escape from the ordinary at the new Tammy Fender spa – overseen by holistic wellness and beauty pioneer Tammy Fender herself.

## Bringing in the Healing Properties of the Outdoors

66 eople have always retreated to South Florida for the healing qualities of the area," says Fender, who grew up in South Florida and currently lives in Palm Beach County. "The ocean, the sunshine, the breeze, and the plants are our greatest healers. It's what recalibrates us and our sense of self. Opal Grand knows that, and they took meticulous care to weave that into the property's surroundings."

Indeed, the design of the property is airy and inviting, yet unhurried. Large circular skylights are anchored by towering trees and tropical potted plants. The 277 rooms, suites, and villas boast soothing hues and ocean blues with private balconies that look out to the sea or Atlantic Avenue. Living walls of greenery, palm fronds,

live-edge wood, and other details summon the breeziness of the outdoors. Fender refers to the overall atmosphere as "sacred in nature," and this is precisely what sealed the deal in opening her second spa location here (her first has been based in West Palm Beach for almost 20 years).

The dining outlets accomplish a similar vibe, particularly the Beach Market and signature restaurant Drift, both of which will be located on the ground floor just steps from the spa. "When I was first developing these concepts," says Scott Luper, director of food and beverage for Opal properties, "I spent time just standing on the corner of Atlantic and Ocean to iust take in everything I saw." He watched people walking, running, even cruising on roller blades, but he couldn't get over how many bicyclists he saw. So he modeled the new market after a bike café – something you see regularly in Europe, but not so much in the US – let alone a hotel resort.

"It's intended to be a hangout for the locals as much as for our guests: a place that allows you to do more than just grab a coffee and go, but actually sit in one of the casual seating areas and recharge and unwind," explains Luper. Design details incorporate live-edge tabletops set upon vintage bikes, laser-cut bike wall art, and even bicycle wheels welded together that line the ceiling.

The ocean, sunshine, and native plants are our greatest healers, says Tammy Fender, and you'll find them incorporated throughout the entire property, inside and out.

## Fuel for Your Spirit

B ut the anti-aging effect isn't solely a product of the all-natural skincare formulations. "My approach to wellness is holistic," explains Fender. "It's not just a facial." Rather, her treatments come coupled with meditation, silence therapy, and energy work (like Reiki). There's even reflexology involved: When Fender is applying masks and manipulating energy at the client's crown chakra, a reflexologist goes to work on the feet, creating an energetic current through the entire body.

"This helps clients become more receptive to their intuition to untangle life's knots." In a world where we are "always on," Fender describes the spa as a sanctuary where it's okay to collapse and be vulnerable. Only from there can you begin to heal. "We help clients craft their intentions, and once they're done, we give them a home care protocol to guide them between visits." Over time, therapists start to see positive shifts in their clients' mental health – not just in their skin.

That sense of nurturing your spirit

continues in the newly designed Drift, the resort's centerpiece restaurant, where Luper, once again, took his inspiration from the area. "I remember walking through the restaurant and staring out at the horizon and seeing big, magnificent vachts and boats. I thought 'I wonder what it would be like to check out of the rat race, disconnect from social media, and just set sail?" At first, you might interpret the concept to be nautical – with elements like woven rope, a billboard-sized mural of sailboats mid-adventure, stacked coral stone walls inlaid with moss. But upon closer inspection, it's all about escaping the daily grind and setting sail...even if it's just for a few hours while you're here for dinner or a few days on vacation. "The goal is to inspire you to chase after your own dreams," Luper adds.

Four to five different zones within the restaurant feature a mix of interior dining room spaces, as well as a handful of outdoor spaces – specifically, the Drift Courtyard, Lounge Terrace, Dining Terrace, and rooftop event deck. So while not every single

## Giving Your Body What It Needs to Heal

f course, as healthy as it is to live an active lifestyle in this area, efforts fall flat if you're not fueling yourself with the proper nourishment. In the Beach Market, expect an assortment of grab-and-go items, but also made-to-order power smoothies, beachside bowls and salads, and handhelds like grilled veggie wraps and grilled chicken caprese on focaccia – all crafted and plated from scratch in front of you at the counter.

Still, no other resort amenity embodies good-for-you ingredients like those you'll find at the new Tammy Fender spa, overseen by the aforementioned local skincare savant and aesthetician to the stars, who counts Gwyneth Paltrow and Julianne Moore among her longtime clients. A-list clientele aside, she's best known for her hand-crafted, plant-based natural skincare formulas that work on a cellular level to bring your skin into perfect balance. We're talking products that are never formulated with parabens, sls, phthalates, petrochemicals, artificial color or fragrance. Peace of mind.

"Some chemical additives may work temporarily, but they can also counteract the benefits you receive, resulting in prematurely aging over the long term" explains the plant and botanical expert, who began her work as an all-natural aesthetician in the late '80s. "We already know that a diet high in plants is good for your body as opposed to one that is high in processed food. It's the same idea when it comes to your skincare."

To that end, you'll see such plant

ingredients (many used medicinally since ancient times) as clary sage, Indian spikenard, vetiver, milk thistle, and iris root in her formulations. In fact, when a client arrives, they go through a diagnostic exercise in which they are asked to sit with 13 different plant essences and smell each one. Fender calls this "working with the life-force of the plant" to identify the scents that appeal most at that very moment. Those selections are then worked into the treatment, which she custom creates right there in the blending room of the spa. In her 30 years of doing this work, she reports that many of her long-term clients look younger now than when they first started treatments with Fender



spot affords you a view of the ocean, you're able to find it just a few feet away. As for the cuisine, there's no single style that the restaurant is locked into – you'll find dishes with culinary traditions rooted in Italy, the Mediterranean, Caribbean, and more.

"That plays off the idea of setting sail again," says Luper. "That, depending on what part of the globe you're at in your journey, that's what you'll be eating. You'll leave feeling reinvigorated."

We'd argue that you'll leave any part of this resort property feeling that way. And that ensures you're bringing more balance back to your everyday life, something we all lack from time to time. *O*




## Delray Beach


#### SCHOOL IS IN SESSION

OW, LOBSTER IS GOOD," reports my friend Shaughn Dugan after taking his first few bites of the buttery toasted roll that's stuffed with shredded lobster and just the tiniest bit of mayo and lemon. After swallowing his third bite, he pauses, then nods knowingly. "Okay. I see why people come to Maine."

I snort. We're not even in Maine yet, but to Shaughn, who grew up in Alexandria, Virginia, it might as well be. Like many of those "from away," whose understanding of New England was shaped by sports teams and middle school geography, Shaughn frequently confuses New Hampshire with Vermont and has a fuzzy and wholly inaccurate image in his head of how Maine looks: just another triangular state beneath French Canada, I suppose. I, myself – who grew up in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire and have hiked all over New England – know a little bit better.

Still, I should cut him some slack. Because the fact of the matter is, from where we are sitting on a balcony off our guest room in this restored grand hotel in New Castle, New Hampshire, Maine's border is actually no more than a mile away, just over the Piscataqua River. And this is just evening one of our three-day, 220-mile road trip in late August of 2019, up the coast of Maine. Tonight, we are staying at Wentworth by the Sea, which serves as an easy (and luxurious) overnight stop for travelers flying into Boston Logan International Airport, just an hour south of where we are relaxing right now. But, tomorrow, we will be off to Midcoast Maine, then the next day, headed to Bar Harbor in the "Down East" region (I decide to wait until day two to explain to Shaughn about how we're going Down East, despite driving north). Our task: to cram in as many coastal Maine towns and attractions as we can while indulging in some R&R at the two Opal resorts where we will be staying each night. My personal goal: show Shaughn that there is more to coastal Maine than lobster.

The next morning, after breakfast in **Latitudes**, one of Wentworth's two award-winning restaurants, we were ready to officially head north. We enter Maine mid-morning, making a couple of essential stops in Portland – the state's must-visit foodie city, with a farm-to-fork philosophy that's the envy of New England – to grab some famous potato donuts and visit a nanobrewery. Then, it's time to leave the city (and I-95) behind and head toward Samoset Resort, by way of US Route 1, the country's very first interstate highway. Locals often refer to it as Coastal Route 1, and once we hit Thomaston, we really begin to see why. Don't get me wrong, the 45-mile stretch between Bath and Thomaston was beautiful with its historic cities, craggy little coves, quintessential lobster shacks, and antique emporiums, but the Midcoast stretch, overlooking the wide expanse of sparkling Penobscot Bay studded with boats, is something else.

When we arrive at **Samoset Resort**, which sits on a sprawl-



ing green peninsula on the bay, three miles north of Rockland's bohemian downtown, it's about 5 p.m. Dinner comes in the form of poached lobster (of course) at **La Bella Vita**, the on-site Italian restaurant, where, from the outdoor terrace, we marvel at the **Rockland Breakwater:** a stunning jetty constructed from massive blocks of granite to shield the bay from ravaging storms in the late 1800s. After Shaughn puts down the last of his lobster, we decide to go explore this sinewy gray line, stretching southward into the ocean like a massive, stony reef.

Walking toward the lighthouse at the end of it, we puzzle over the perfect flatness of the structure; each stone was cut to fit into place. The breakwater extends nearly a full mile, making the walk feel like an endless skim over ocean. By the time we reach the lighthouse, the rosy sunset has faded, and we are flanked by the

lights of Rockland, the distant landmass of islands North Haven and Vinalhaven, and the diamond-strewn sky above. And for a moment, we are wordless, staring up at the brilliant stars.

Sunrise brings a gentle morning mist to the bucolic scenery surrounding the resort on our second morning. The resort is known for some of the best golfing in New England, but I didn't understand just how integral the sport was until I looked down from my balcony to see the sixth hole. The golf course isn't just alongside the resort – it fully encompasses it. Leaving our ocean-view cottage in the morning light, we are immersed in the verdant fairways and accompanied by the satisfying thwack of golf balls as they are toward the putting green.

We have a full itinerary planned for the next 10 hours – including art galleries, wineries, and even a short hike – but

Shaughn isn't going anywhere until he gets his "recommended daily lobster," he jokes. "Lobster benedict it is," he devises while looking over the menu in the lobby. We reluctantly leave Samoset Resort around 9 a.m. en route to our first stop, the **Farnsworth** Art Museum, located at the corner of Rockland's Main Street and the eponymous Museum Street. A stylish woman behind the desk eyes us and our hiking clothes. "Two adults?" she asks. "I'd like to think so," I try. She laughs and hands us guides, and then we're on our own to discover the immensity of the 20,000-square-foot museum. Inside, we find a papier-mâché spider made by local schoolchildren, an intricate spirograph of fishing line patterning a domed ceiling, and a whole exhibit devoted to Jamie Wyeth's heart-wrenching paintings of his wife and muse, Phyllis Wyeth, after her car accident. As we go to leave, another docent stops us.

"Don't forget to go to the second building," he hollers. "There's more?!" asks an incredulous Shaughn, who just got lost while looking for the bathroom. "Go out to the right and look for Andy Warhol staring down at you from the steeple. You can't miss it." Sure enough, we turn the corner to see exactly what was

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described to us: a 30-foot-high visage of Andy Warhol against a white church spire, gazing open-mouthed as though he is surprised that we stopped by. "That is hard to miss," says Shaughn

By mid-morning, we're on our way out of Rockland and heading north on Route 1 again, up through the sibling towns of Rockport and Camden. While I know Camden offers a quaint downtown, home to eighteenth-century buildings and boutique shopping galore, Shaughn and I both have our sights set on the neighboring Camden Hills State Park, a 5,500-acre park offering hiking trails and sweeping views of Penobscot Bay. The park ranger with an Appalachian Trail tattoo (which I took as a telltale sign that

she had hoofed the 2,200-mile route) hands us a map, then points us in the direction of the Mount Battie Trail. A short hike up the half-mile trail to the 800-foot peak gives us an appreciation for the park ranger's monumental feat and delivers us to a stone tower that overlooks Camden Harbor, teeming with sun-bleached sailboats.

Shortly after noon, we're back in the car. But rather than continuing along Coastal Route 1, we turn inland toward Lincolnville, heading through farm country to **Cellardoor Winery**. Just as we pull up and get out, a sudden summer rain begins to pour down on us, so it isn't until we run into the tasting room and sit down that we notice the sprawling vineyard, blanketed with a layered mist

from the pop-up storm and catching glints of the reemerging sun. It's over samples of their 20 wines made largely from imported grapes (with the exception of their ice wine) that Shaughn finally confesses, "I may have had too much lobster."

After an intentionally lobster-less late lunch in the revitalized downtown of Belfast, home to redbrick Victorian-era buildings and sea captains' mansions perched on a hill overlooking Penobscot Bay, we realize gray clouds are rolling in. This puts a bit of a damper on our next stop: the Penobscot Narrows Bridge and **Observatory**. The tallest bridge observatory in the world at 447 feet, Penobscot Narrows offers 360-degree views extending to








Mt. Desert Island and Acadia on a clear day. But today is not clear. No bother: Our guide at the top of the elevator, Terry, gives us a local lesson anyway. She's from Prospect, the town at the foot of the landmark that witnessed both the closing of the old bridge when rust was discovered deep in the cable system and the advent of the 2003 bridge with its unique observatory that has drawn people from all over the world. "We call this the 'toll bridge," explains Terry, meaning that tourism actually paid for the bridge to be built over time.

Back on US Route 1, subdued by the weather, we cross over the sparse farmlands and land bridges of Maine's craggy coast in a comfortable silence. The landscape from Penobscot Narrows to Mt. Desert Island is stark but beautiful, with long stretches of marshes and fields dotted by small fishing villages. And before we know it, we're there, crossing the land bridge onto Mt. Desert Island, home of **Acadia National Park**. We weave our way along the coast until brightly colored seafood shacks give way to hotels and motels and we know we are approaching Bar Harbor, which sits in the shadow of the park.

Compared to the last hour amid stark farms and marshes, the tiny downtown of Bar Harbor feels like a heavily concentrated dose of Maine. Hotels, restaurants, and tourist shops decorated with colorful buoys stand shoulder to shoulder on the brightly lit streets. West Street abruptly ends at the ocean, where whale watching tour boats sit at the ready. A stream of poncho-clad people pass us, chatting enthusiastically. I'm eager to explore the downtown before sundown, so I rush Shaughn to check in to our final Opal Collection resort for the night, **West Street Hotel**, where, tucked

into the heart of all the activity, we have an amazing view of the bustling street from our balcony, not to mention Frenchman Bay's neighboring Porcupine Islands.

As the sun begins to set, we weave through the lit shops. I expected that – with the touristy atmosphere – to find mostly tchotchkes and trinkets, but I am surprised to discover largely artisan crafts: Local leatherwork, pottery, and jewelry line the shelves and make the storefronts of Cottage and Main Streets feel less commercial and more cozy (I am unable, though, to convince Shaughn to buy a lobster keychain). After about an hour of perusing, we hear live fiddle music pouring out of **Paddy's Irish Pub** & **Restaurant** as we re-enter West Street. It adds to the ebullient environment of the little sea-facing buildings on their tall piers. Naturally, we put our name in for the restaurant to a chorus of fans clapping along with the Celtic band.

"This is really cool. This is a real place," Shaughn says as

we're seated, and I think about how places that are touristy sometimes get the reputation of being commodified locations, the same everywhere you go, but Maine has always struck me as outside of that cycle. From the unpredictable weather to the locals who both work and live here, Maine is its own experience.


Shaughn seems to echo my thoughts: "It's unlike any place I've ever been..." he trails off as he looks out at the bay where, earlier today, sea kayakers had followed the same currents that commercial fishing boats have followed for centuries. And for a moment, I find myself looking at this place through his eyes – as a community that fosters tourism by amplifying, rather than silencing, the echo of history.

I know he gets it, but I still can't help but laugh when Shaughn, clutching his menu, spots a specific dish and his eyes go wide.

"Let's get Irish lobster!" O

Seek Some Refuge Start the day off with a step back in time at the House of Refuge at Gilbert's Bar, located on

the southern end of Hutchinson Island. Originally built by the US Life-Saving Service in 1876, 10 of these life-saving stations were scattered across Florida's Atlantic Coast, where keepers were tasked with searching for survivors of shipwrecks, taking in injured and stranded sailors, and nursing them back to health. Today, as the last remaining House of Refuge, the site maintains a keeper's living quarters just as you would have seen it in 1904.



#### Rare Rocks

In a region studded with miles of sandy beaches, the unique craggy limestone shore at

Blowing Rocks Preserve on Jupiter Island, located a mere four miles north of Jupiter Beach Resort & Spa, looks as though it belongs in Acadia National Park in Maine. Managed by The Nature Conservancy, the preserve boasts the largest Anastasia limestone outcropping on the state's east coast, creating cliff-like rock formations that, during rough seas or high tide, shoot water spouts as high as 50 feet in the air.



#### Lunch with a Unique View

With dishes that focus on Florida's abundance of fresh ingredients and seafood, Jupiter

Beach Resort & Spa's signature restaurant, Sinclairs Ocean Grill, has built a solid reputation as one of Jupiter's best restaurants – not to mention, it's the only one with an oceanfront view. Take a seat on the outdoor terrace and dig into a wide variety of Florida-inspired food, such as jumbo lump crab cakes and Atlantic black grouper alongside favorites including beef short ribs and Tuscan chicken.





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If you're a sick or injured sea turtle - or if you want to do your part to support the sea turtles that nest on 9.5 miles of shore in Juno Beach, Jupiter, and Tequesta - the Loggerhead Marinelife Center is the place to go. Guided tours offer an up-close look at the outdoor hospital, where you can learn about each patient's story, injuries, and treatment plan. Think of it as Grey's Anatomy for sea turtles.



#### It's Worth It

Okay, you've already done a lot today, but who doesn't have time for a little retail therapy? Worth

Avenue in Palm Beach boasts impressive architecture, more than three dozen shops, and a place in history as one of the centers of Gilded Age society. Special events are scheduled year-round, so don't be surprised to find yourself in the middle of an arts festival, a jewelry or classic car show, or the annual pet parade.



### Relish a Caribbean

After the scenic half-hour drive down A1A, a coastal byway that runs from Amelia Island to the Keys, check in at **Opal Grand Oceanfront Resort** & Spa. This shoreside sanctuary, located right on Atlantic Avenue in Delray Beach, just completed a top-to-bottom renovation in 2021 and features water walls, living green walls, and swinging chairs amid teak, terrazzo, and shell-stone touches.



#### Rock Down to Atlantic Avenue **Atlantic Avenue** is the beating

heart of Delray Beach, known as "Florida's Village by the Sea" and rated "most fun small town" by Rand McNally. Admire vibrant murals as you stroll through the Pineapple Grove Arts District, and grab dinner or drinks at **Sandbar**, a casual tiki bar with a huge sandy patio overlooking the ocean. Or, head to the Arts Garage to catch a poetry or comedy open mic, some soulful blues, a drag show, or traditional Cuban music.

#### Some Morning Monkeying Around

After taking a morning dip in either the ocean (located just across Ocean Boulevard from Opal Grand) or the resort pool, head to breakfast at Monkey Bar, the resort's on-site restaurant. With an interior accented with living green walls, a bar set beneath a foliage-wrapped canopy, and a large overhead skylight, it feels a bit like dining in the heart of the jungle – there's even hanging ceramic monkeys. Along with fresh-squeezed juices and a signature bloody mary, choose from classic morning fare like made-to-order omelets, Belgian waffles, and crème brûlée french toast.



#### Crossroads of Culture

Once home to a small community of Japanese farmers who resettled in Boca Raton in the early 1900s to grow pineapples, the Morikami Museum & Japanese **Gardens** is now a cultural landmark. Past exhibitions have showcased Japanese art forms ranging from bamboo baskets to tattoos to the architecture featured in science fiction anime films – plus there's a permanent bonsai exhibit. If you arrive on

traditional tea ceremony in the Seishin-an

Tea House, or take a "stroll for well-being" in the gardens – inspired by Japan's popular "forest bathing" practice.



#### Alligator Alley

The Everglades Parkway, aka Alligator Alley, runs across the state and through the northern portion of the Everglades, so keep your

eyes peeled for one of Florida's 1.25 million alligators (possibly more, as some may not have returned their census forms yet). Just off the east end of the Alley, stop at the Florida Panther National Wildlife

Refuge to stretch your legs along a loop trail that travels through ancient oak trees and tropical vegetation to a boardwalk and overlook where you can watch for osprey and hawks, deer, bear, and – yes – the occasional panther.



#### Home Suite Home

Take a breather on your private balcony at Edgewater Beach

**Hotel**, looking out over the gentle waves of the Gulf of Mexico. The Edgewater's 125 beachfront suites, with one or two bedrooms, feature gourmet kitchens, cozy dining areas, and comfy sand-toned couches, making the hotel a true home away from home.




#### Golden Oldie

Stroll among beach cottages, mansions, coconut palms, and banyan trees in charming Olde

Naples, finding your way to Gallery Row - three square blocks of art galleries, antique shops, and auction houses (plus some excellent eateries). Check out the fresh, contemporary installations at **Up Art** and Design Gallery and the eclectic collection of paintings, sculpture, and glass at Gardner Colby Galleries, and make sure to snap a pic of **Palm Cottage**, Naples's oldest home, at the corner of 12th Avenue South and Gulf Shore Boulevard. Built in 1895, it's constructed of tabby mortar, a handmade concrete made from a mixture of sand, shells, and water.

After breakfast at Edgewater's on-site restaurant, Coast, stroll south to the Naples Pier at the end of 12th Avenue, built in 1888 as a dock for freight and passengers. Destroyed by fire and hurricanes over the decades, the pier has been rebuilt multiple times; the current version extends a thousand feet into the water, making it a great spot to see pelicans, dolphins, and stingrays, and to
